

Focus-Pupil Premium 2015-2016

At Oakfield there are currently 63 pupil premium learners. This is 69.23% of our school population.

Pupil Premium is additional funding from the government which schools use to raise the attainment of those learners.

Our allocation funding for the year April 2015-April 2016 is £70,342.
